Obituary for Juliet Pienaar

St Stephen Parish Council are deeply saddened to announce the death of their former Clerk Juliet Pienaar.

Highly committed, Juliet worked enthusiastically and energetically, serving the Council with distinction for many years. As a Parish we were extremely fortunate to have, for so long, someone with so much knowledge. She undertook her duties with loyalty and

wholeheartedness. Possessing common sense, humour and kindness, Juliet inspired admiration, respect and affection in those who had the opportunity to work with her.

Juliet became unwell in the summer of 2017. She fought her illness with remarkable courage and fortitude, being much frustrated by the ill health which prevented her from continuing in the job she loved. Sadly, it became necessary to retire from the Council on health grounds in 2018.

With thanks for the personal sacrifices Juliet made in working as she did, our condolences go to Gavin, their sons Troye and Daniel, her parents and wider family. Our thoughts are with them all at such a very sad time.

Tree Safety Works

The Parish Council has a duty to do all that is reasonably practicable to ensure that people are not exposed to risk. For this reason, we undertake a tree survey of our green spaces, every three years. The most recent survey has identified quite a few trees that require dead wood to be removed from the crown and some that, unfortunately, need to be felled. The work has been taking place this autumn and we'll leave dead wood in woodland for wildlife where possible.

Local contributions recognised

Your Parish Council presented seven Community Awards this year at the Parish Awards Evening in September. Guest Speaker Malcolm Hull from Butterfly Conservation gave a talk on the 'Butterflies of St Stephen Parish'.

- Jenny Wilson (Community Category), who is Brown Owl to a Brownie pack and cooks for St Luke's Lunch Club



- Hanstead Wood Volunteers (Group Category), for securing continued public access to the woodland
- Burston Nurseries & Garden Centre (Business Category), for supporting community events such as the Community Carol Concert, Parish in Bloom and the Bricket Wood Art Club's annual show
- Bricket Wood Pharmacy (Business Category), for outstanding personal service of high quality

Following judging over the summer the 2019 Parish in Bloom Awards were also presented at the Awards Evening.

Residents Associations presented their Best Kept Front Garden Awards and Graham Wilson from St Stephens Gardening Club presented Park Street School with the Inter-Schools Competition



trophy. Winners of the overall Parish Best Kept Front garden were Alan and Susan Fenton of Stanley Avenue. The Best Kept Allotment went to Robert Tofts for his allotment at Park Street Lane and the Best Kept Allotment Newcomer was Jonathan McGetterick at Tippendell Lane. Best Floral Business Display was presently jointly to the Black Boy Public House in Bricket Wood and Traffic Self Drive in Park Street.

Projects in the Parish

With the building of additional housing in the area, your Parish Council can access Section 106 funding through the District Council. This funding is a contribution from developers toward the costs of providing community and social infrastructure.
