# When every second counts

The two new Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) will be installed at the Parish Centre, Bricket Wood, and Park Street Recreation Ground. Your Parish Council was awarded the equipment, along with DefibSafe cabinets and a CPR Training Kit, by the British Heart Foundation



The kit includes enough equipment to train ten people at a time, and in the first instance will be offered to groups using the Council's halls and sports facilities. However, the new AEDs, as well as the existing AED at Greenwood Park, can be used by anyone, irrespective of training, as the machine will talk the user through the whole procedure.

Cllr Mick Freeman, Parish Council Chairman, commented: "The speed at which aid can be given to someone who has had a cardiac arrest is such an important factor in their survival. Wherever you are in the Parish, a public access AED is freely available to use in an emergency."

### An ace service for tennis booking

Greenwood Park Tennis Club has introduced an online booking system (www.greenwoodtennis.com) for both members and non-members, making it easier to check court availability and book. The public court can be booked for £5/hour, online or with the ClubSpark Booker smartphone app. Cash bookings can still be made at the Day 1 Newsagent on the corner of Tippendell Lane and Watford Road. The Kidszone minicourt, specifically designed for children aged 3–9 years, can be booked for £2/hour at the newsagent; annual Kidszone membership is only £12, and allows the court to be booked online for free.





# Play areas to be upgraded

Your Parish Council is responsible for play areas at Greenwood Park, Park Street Recreation Ground, Mayflower Road, North Close, Cherry Hill and Woodbury Field, all of which are well used. A number of new items have been purchased, at a substantial discount, to replace or augment the existing equipment.

The new equipment will be installed in the above play areas (with the exception of Greenwood Park) by the summer holidays. The first play area to benefit will be Woodbury Field, where a new slide will be installed, together with a 'snooker wall' (pictured). At Greenwood Park we have plans for a 'Super Net', a large piece of equipment that will replace the present 'witches hat' climbing net and provide years of enjoyment for local children. Greenwood Park's popularity grows year on year. It has gained the Green Flag Award for the last three years and been praised in the District Council's Green Spaces report. Your Council is seeking authority from the District Council to use Section 106 money – received from developers when they build, and held by the District Council for leisure use within the Parish – to pay for the 'Super Net' and other improvements to the Park.

### **Extending the Greenwood Park Pavilion**

Following the granting of planning permission, your Parish Council – working closely with Greenwood Park Tennis Club – has secured a £75K 'Inspired Facilities' grant from Sport England towards the extension of and improvements to Greenwood Park Sports Pavilion. The remainder will be co-funded by the Council and the club. David Thompson, Vice-Chairman of the GPLTC, commented: "We are delighted with the success of our bid to gain this necessary funding. We will now be able to proceed with the much needed improvements to the Pavilion facilities."

### 2015 Remembrance Day

A parade of standards along Park Street by more than 120 young people began the annual Remembrance Day Service at St Stephen Parish War Memorial in November.

More than 600 people gathered to pay tribute to the fallen of both World Wars and more recent conflicts. Wreathes were laid by Cllr Salih Gaygusuz, Mayor of St Albans City & District, local Councillors, representatives from local groups, organisations and churches, serving and veteran armed forces personnel, and families of local servicemen lost in recent conflicts. A record 18 of the local Guiding and Scouting units paraded their colours. The service was conducted by Chris Short, Pastor of Park Street Baptist Church. Cllr Dorothy Kerry, Parish Vice-Chairman, read the tribute, with Cllr Mick Freeman, Chairman, laying the wreath on behalf of your Parish Council. Cllr Freeman thanked all participants, including the local police team who not only attended the service but also manned the road closure, providing a safe route for the parade and enough room for all attendees.



### Gathering winter fu-u-el

Tree felling operations have recently been carried out in St Julians and Blackgreen woods, both of which are managed by your Parish Council. Although the work may sometimes appear rather drastic, it is essential to rejuvenate the woodlands. The felled wood has many uses: some is taken by our contractor in lieu of payment, some is used by your Council on local projects and some forms log piles which will act as habitats for wildlife. Generally no wood must be removed by residents without the Council's express permission. However, from time to time surplus timber will be left in piles near the gates to the wood with a sign indicating that residents are welcome to take some of the wood for their own personal use. Please take from the piles sensibly, but leave some for others.



### Harperbury Hospital housing development

Your Parish Council considers the proposed development at the former Harperbury Hospital would provide a good mix of properties and a sufficient supply of affordable homes. However, we have indicated that the safety of Harper Lane Bridge remains a concern and it is disappointing that the scheme will not generate any Community Infrastructure Levy funding to improve sporting facilities within the Parish since the Park Street Recreation Ground is not close enough to the development.

# Rail Freight Terminal update

We welcomed the decision taken by the County Council to reiterate its opposition to the proposed development of the Strategic Rail Freight Terminal at the former Radlett Aerodrome site. At the time of writing, no approach to purchase the land has been made by the developer HelioSlough, but should an offer be made we hope the County Council will consider alternatives that will better serve the local community.

# **Abbey Flyer improvements**

We are pleased that Network Rail and the County Council have agreed to develop options for a 30-minute frequency for the St Albans to Watford Abbey Line, and that, as part of the extension of London Midland's current contract, a laterrunning service will be introduced.



# Supporting the local community

At its November meeting your Parish Council once again approved a range of discounts and grants to support local community organisations and organisers of charity fundraising events.

Local Residents' Associations, Park Street Neighbourhood Watch, Community Rail Partnership, Abfly (the Abbey Flyer Users' Group) and the St Stephens Gardening Club were granted discounts for committee meetings and one special event per year, such as the Park Street Residents Association Craft Fair (on 5 June). Additionally, your Council approved applications from the organisers of fundraising events for the Hearing Dogs for the Deaf, Macmillan Cancer Support and Waverley Driving for the Disabled, as well as grants to support the senior citizens clubs, with St Luke's Lunch Club receiving £400 and Holy Trinity's 'In Touch' Club receiving £600.

# Grant funding for Neighbourhood Plan

Your Parish Council has obtained a further grant from the Community Rights Programme (CRP) to help with development of the Neighbourhood Plan, which, once adopted, will influence the future of Bricket Wood, Chiswell Green and Park Street.



Cllr Bill Pryce, who is leading the Neighbourhood Plan initiative, said:

"While much of the work formulating the plan is being undertaken by local residents on a voluntary basis, this grant will enable your Council to fund essential external support. Although there is a depth of talent and expertise within the volunteer force, there will be areas where we need the assistance of specialists to ensure that the Plan is sufficiently robust and effective." He also reiterated the need for local residents to have their say in the development of the Plan (neighbourhoodplan@ststephenparishcouncil.gov.uk).

The 16th Annual Community Carol Concert at Greenwood Park in December once again saw children from all the Parish's junior schools giving outstanding performances to a full house of friends, families, local residents and invited guests, including St Albans City & District Mayor, Cllr Salih Gaygusuz, accompanied by the Mayoress, Anne Main MP and local Councillors. The Christmas message and prayer was delivered by Revd Dr Nick Weir, Vicar of Holy Trinity Church, Frogmore.

The free event was supported by volunteers, including the 220 St Albans Squadron Air Training Corps, Salsa Mish, choirmaster Ian La Riviere, sound engineer Simon Whittle and Penny Farmer, Shaun the Sheep's owner, with Sainsbury's at London Colney donating all the refreshments. A bucket collection raised £464 for this year's nominated charity, the Stroke Association.

This may be about to change as Tarmac, owner of the gravel pits and lakes, recently agreed to allow this route to be a Designated Right of Way with the County Council. The path should be officially opened very soon.

### 2016/17 Precept set

Your Parish Councillors recently faced the unenviable task of setting the Precept for 2016/17. This is never an easy matter, because we wish to maintain the current facilities and events enjoyed by many, but also to make further improvements. At the same time, we must keep the Precept at a level that will not be hard to swallow for Parish residents. After much debate and discussion the Precept has been increased by 2.9%, which for a band 'D' house is an increase of £1.84 per year.
