#### Park Street Pickers: 'Great and Green'

'Don't Be a Tosser' is the official strapline of the Park Street Pickers, who recently won the Herts Advertiser Community Award, 'Great and Green' section.

On the third Sunday morning of every other month, the Pickers assemble at Park Street Recreation Ground armed with bags and litter-picking sticks, then depart their several ways to collect the litter that has been deposited by careless and/or thoughtless people. While most of their work is within Park Street, they have ners & Finalists

been further afield into Bricket Wood and Chiswell Green. Their concern is to keep the area clean, tidy and free from the detritus that makes our village look unkempt and messy. The bags of litter are stored and collected, usually the following day, by the District Council.

The sessions – run by Cllrs Wendy Berriman, John Bell, Eileen Whittaker and Dorothy Kerry – gave children of all ages the opportunity to try out lots of different crafts, with the materials provided by your Parish Council.

Cllr Berriman commented: "We had all ages coming along to take part – they were able try out all sorts of crafts that they might not have done before, make lots of mess, have something to take away with them and explore our award-winning Greenwood Park and Community Centre."

# Categories revised for Parish in Bloom 2017

Competition categories for Parish in Bloom, which is run to encourage everyone to take pride in your Parish by improving the area with floral displays, have been revised for 2017.

Eight Best Kept Front Gardens in each ward will be selected by Parish Councillors, from which the overall Parish winner and runners-up will be selected. A new Best Hanging Basket or Container category will allow residents without gardens to be recognised. Allotment, Business and Schools categories remain unchanged, but there will be no Best Kept Back Garden category. The three Residents' Associations will continue with their own competitions and present their awards at the Parish in Bloom Awards evening. At this year's event (pictured), in September, the efforts of gardeners from all around your Parish were recognised. Winners included How Wood School (Inter Schools Garden Competition, run by the St Stephen Gardening Club, in association with your Parish Council), Mr and Mrs Crook of Chiswell Green (Best Kept Front Garden), Mr and Mrs Gledhill of Chiswell Green (Best Kept Back Garden), Mrs Janet Gardiner (Best Kept Allotment), Mrs Agnieszka Nemcek (Best Allotment Newcomer) and the Black Boy Public House (Best Business Floral Display).



#### Exciting new play equipment at Greenwood Park

The new Greenwood Park Play Area was officially opened by your Parish Council on 1 November 2016, following the completion of the 'Supanet' project, the majority of which was funded by Section 106 money (from developments within the Parish).

The old Witch's Hat climbing frame and two other pieces of equipment have been replaced by a large new Spacenet climbing frame, with a large play sand base and extensions, a triple rope trail for younger children, a set of turning bars suitable for all ages and a new improved zip line.

Guests from the District Council were invited, and children representing the local schools were among the first to use the equipment, which forms the largest part of the ambitious Parish Playgrounds Improvement Project addressing playgrounds throughout your Parish.



#### **Bricket Wood Station Project**

The only remaining station building on your Abbey Line railway should be returned to its former glory, and become a community asset for use by all, rather than remaining a bricked-up shell. That is the aim of the Station Project Group, which is supported by your Parish Council and the Bricket Wood Residents' Association (BWRA), and made up of individual residents with particular skills, with representatives of your Parish Council, the BWRA, the Abbey Flyer Users' Group and the Bricket Wood Society.

Phase 1 involves establishing an organisational and financial structure, discussions with Network Rail (the owner), a full survey of the building, market research and development of a business plan, as well as design development and options to include planning application and building regulations.

In this respect the train operator, London Midland, is most supportive and has pledged a generous donation. This, coupled with financial pledges from the organisations mentioned, along with those from Park Street Residents Association, Railfuture and a number of individuals – for which many thanks – has enabled extra funding to be granted by the Designated Community Rail Development Fund.

The 'Project' is therefore now in a position to fully prepare Phase 1, as a precursor to actually starting work on restoring the building, subject to Network Rail. We will, in due course, be looking for help and support from anyone who would like to be involved in this exciting community project.

#### Abbey Line under threat – again

Residents are encouraged to respond to the County Council's Transport Vision 2050 consultation by 14 December.

This is an opportunity to add your voice to that of your Parish Council and the Abbey Flyer Users' Group (ABFLY) in support of preserving and improving the Abbey Line railway rather than replacing it with a concrete bus lane.

The 'Vision' is long-term (i.e. what the County needs by 2050) and mainly positive, but reintroduces the prospect of replacing the Abbey Line with Bus Rapid Transit (BRT). This is similar to the scheme presented in the 2015 County Draft Rail Strategy, to which ABFLY rallied considerable opposition, and to which your Parish Council objected.

ABFLY commented: "Just over one year ago, in summer 2015, over 80% of respondents to another [County] consultation expressed their opposition to such a scheme, and their support for retaining and enhancing the Abbey Line as a rail service. It appears that these views have been roundly ignored in what ABFLY describe as an 'insult to the democratic process'. ABFLY's opposition to BRT revolves around five key concerns; environmental impact, passenger comfort and perception, loss of network benefits, reliability and cost."
